Cries from the Cross (A Journey Into the Heart of Jesus) by Erin Lutzer

Among Christ's 7 cries from the cross were a cry of pardon "Father forgive them" and a cry of anguish "My God, why have You forsaken Me?". To stand at the foot of the cross is to witness "how God so loved the world". The attributes of love and wrath of God are displayed as well as the contradiction of God's sovereignty versus free will. The cross, previously an instrument of indescribable cruelty, is now often worn as a pendant—a mere symbol of spirituality of every sort. The "offense of the cross" has long since vanished. Many who wear it just as jewelry would be shocked at its true meaning. Unless we see ourselves as deserving the verdict that Pilate gave Jesus, we will never understand the cross.

Cries From the Cross reveals how we can get the world to believe in our Redeemer. A well-known atheist said of Christians, "I might believe in their Redeemer if they were to look more redeemed."
